What is the Carls Center?

The Carls Center for Clinical Care and Education is a multidisciplinary clinic located in the Health Professions Building on the campus of Central Michigan University offering services in the fields of Audiology, Psychology, and Speech-Language Pathology. The Physical Therapy Hands-for-Health Clinic also operates out of the Carls Center.

The center is also a dynamic collaborative community of practitioner/scholars committed to providing compassionate healthcare through

excellence in education, service and research.

Referrals

Some of the services we provide require you to have a referral from your family or primary care physician in order for us to bill your insurance company. We will be asking you questions when we schedule to help determine if a referral is needed. The Carls Center office staff can assist in contacting

your physician, about obtaining this referral. If we have been unable to obtain this referral we will contact you prior to your appointment.



Audiology Clinic is one of the largest audiology clinics in Michigan. CMU provides the most comprehensive audiology services in Mid-Michigan and serves persons of all ages. **Basic Audiology Services**—such as hearing testing and hearing instrument fitting, Electrophysiological Diagnostic Services, Vestibular Assessment and Electrocochleography (ECoChG), Canalith Repositioning.

The goal of the **Psychological Training and Consultation Center** is to train students enrolled in the applied graduate programs within the Department of Psychology at Central Michigan University. This center offers state-of-the-art psychological services to infants, children, adolescents, adults, and the elderly in individual, couple, family, or group formats.

Hands for Health (HfH) is a student-faculty staffed clinic that serves members of the greater Mt. Pleasant community who are uninsured, or otherwise unable to pay for needed Physical Therapy Services. For more information, please call (989) 774-1298.

Speech—Language Pathology Clinics offer diagnostic and treatment services for people of all ages with speech or language impairments related to neurological disease and brain injury, speech and language delay, developmental disorders, hearing impairment, stuttering, voice disorders, or foreign accent.

CMU's **Fall and Balance Center** focuses on fall prevention assessment, rehabilitation for balance disorders as well as those with medical conditions that predispose them to a risk

for falling. Among its key features, the center:

- Accepts patient referrals from physicians.
- Complements services offered by area health care providers.
- Ranks as a charter member of the Michigan Fall Prevention Partnership.
- Enhances health profession student education and gives specialized service with state-of-the-art equipment, including a NeuroCom Unit, which tests balance with a computer evaluation.
- Includes vestibular rehabilitation services.
- Serves as a clearinghouse for the dissemination of fall prevention and balance assessment-related resources and best practices by providing access to information via the Web, written materials, workshops, symposiums, and conferences.
